From the Trustees:

The Trustees remain hard at work to continue to make our church space better and better. Many thanks go out to the group of congregants who got together a few Saturdays ago to do a clean-up of the basement on the Fellowship side. Much work was done to spruce up and discard items to make that area more user friendly. In doing so, some items were saved to be added to a church flea market effort on May 7th. From the Missions Committee:

Greetings from the Mission Committee! We are happy to be getting some of our regular Mission Projects back up and going.

We are reactivating the Food of the Month collection for the Hooksett Community Food Pantry. The food item for April will be boxed mashed potatoes.

The Snacks for Schools project is still being utilized in the Hooksett school system. Kathy Tilton has been our contact with the schools these many years; as things continue to open up we anticipate this need may increase again.

On April 3rd, we will be doing a collection for One Great Hour of Sharing. This supports people in need nationally and worldwide, those who are suffering

from things like the wildfires out West, and the tornados that have ravaged the South.

Missions has also joined the National UCC in its efforts to raise money for the Ukraine Relief Fund. The UCC/Church World Services, is part of the ACT Alliance. ACT stands for Action by Churches Together – it has 145 church and church affiliate members from over 120 countries. Through ACT, CWS will partner with Hungarian Interchurch Aid, assisting refugees at the Ukrainian-Hungarian border. CWS has also deployed a small team of experts to Moldova and Romania to assess the situation and growing needs of Ukrainians fleeing the violence. They anticipate that their expertise in child protection may be needed, 89% of the Ukrainian refugees crossing into Moldova, for example, are women and children. In addition to child protection, CWS is identifying other opportunities to aid Ukrainians and the local communities who receive them, such as, health care, food, shelter, livelihoods, water, sanitation and cash assistance.

So far we have received \$625 for the Ukraine Relief Fund, Thank you so much!! Anyone wishing to make a donation can make a check payable to our church with the Ukraine Relief Fund written in the memo section. There are blue and yellow ribbons available at church for anyone who wishes to take one.

Also included in our planning for this year is the Crop Walk, Thanksgiving Baskets, and of course, the Angel Tree.
