We are now serving communion instead of handing out communion cups as people enter the sanctuary. Communion is served on the first Sunday of every month.

From the Trustees:

December is going to be a busy month for the Trustees. The biggest task will be the 2023 Budget. A budget meeting was held in November to put a tentative plan together. If you wish to see that document please ask Jeff Hamilton for an electronic copy. Generally, things have remained unchanged except for adjusting the Pastor salary from fulltime to 3/4 time and making adjustments to meet anticipated increases in expenditures like utilities and such. Changes were also made to some salaried positions such as the music director (a combined position of both the accompanist and the choir director) and the administrative assistant position.

In a time where there is not much good news around money and funds we wanted to highlight a success with our current budget. In a typical year our church would have withdrawn between \$80-\$100,000 from investments to make ends meet BUT to date, we have only withdrawn \$10,000 this year. We hope to continue this momentum going into the future although there are a few new costs as mentioned in the previous paragraph. As a group, to help with this, we decided to include a covenant goal this year of \$67,000. In the past, this has been a number we plug in after covenants are received but in changing it we hope setting this mark will give more clarity for funds needed to offset costs for next year's budget. Overall, the budget work went well and hopefully it will be something that our church can move forward with in the new year.

The trustees have had many requests for the use of the church and are excited about how our building is being used for our immediate and local community. It is our belief that the more we can utilize our space for events like meetings, fitness classes and meals it will help grow our body of faith and allow us to fulfill the mission of our church.

Thanks to all who participated in the clean-up in late November. We raked lots of leaves, made improvements on the Community Kitchen sign and did lots of work on the inside by washing windows, cleaning the pews and the kitchen.

Time to wrap up this song...


Pick out an ornament or maybe two!
