Also, we would like to thank all of our volunteers for the past year. We are so fortunate to have the support of our church family and community volunteers - we couldn't do it without you!

From the Trustees:

As the new year begins the Trustees will propose the budget for the upcoming year at the Annual Meeting on January 8th immediately following service. As it stands right now pledged offering exceeds \$82,000 which is \$40,000 more than what was pledged last year. A few new items are included in the 2023 budget including a salaried position for our Administrative Assistant, a combined salary for the Music Director (formerly the Accompanist and Choir Director position) and a Capital Improvement fund added for upcoming projects like a garage roof and landscape improvements on the grounds, just to name couple. The thought behind the Capital Improvement Fund is to set aside money that can be designated to earmarked projects in the near future or a "rainy day" fund for long term or unexpected costs. Even with those additions we plan to withdraw a significant lower amount from our investments due to the pledges made, which also happened this year! Thanks to all who have pledged or will contribute to bring our budget numbers to fruition.

As of January 8th new members will be added to the board but we are still looking for more to fulfill our duties as Trustees. There was discussion at our last meeting that the expectation of a Trustee does not necessarily mean you need to fix a toilet or mow the lawn. Some of the "expected" duties of our board need to be rethought and can be accomplished in ways different from past practice. In saying this, we hope folks who may be contributing members in this role, but have resisted because of a concern they will not be able to contribute as they think they need to, might reconsider. If this information allays some of those fears and you have any interest please reach out to a Trustee or a member of the Nominating committee. Thanks for considering helping out our church.
