ORGAN: We voted to have a cleaning and inspection performed on the organ. We were told by the organist that there were a few issues with it. Keep your fingers crossed!

COMCAST: We voted to change our service with Comcast. We got rid of the television service, so we now only have telephone and internet service. Our bill is now a lot lower!

VESTRY FURNITURE: If you have to move the Vestry furniture for any reason, please do not slide it. Pick it up, please! We have noticed numerous pulls in the carpeting. We are looking into putting slides on the feet of the furniture.



And let us pray for those fathers who have died, but live on in our memory and whose love continues to nurture us.


