

Although All Saints Sunday is celebrated on November 1, it is linked in history and thought to Halloween celebrated the night before. According to Dictionary.com "The first records of the word Halloween come from around the 1550s. Halloween is sometimes spelled Hallowe'en, reflecting the fact that its name comes from a shortening of Allhallows Even. Allhallows is another name for the Christian holiday known as All Saints' Day." We are all saints as people who have a relationship with God and are devoted to Jesus. Saints are not the perfect ones, but the ones who are separated by that relationship from the rest of the world. As saints we are called to live to the best of our ability as Christ lived knowing that it is a standard we can never truly attain. On All Saints Day we remember those who have helped us on our own journeys and at the same time remember that we are called to be saints ourselves. In that spirit comes this prayer.

Ever-present God. There are many who need your special care, comfort, and strength. There are those facing uncertain and scary health situations, relationship problems, financial stress, and emotional turmoil. There are people who are homeless and helpless and people whose lives have been ravaged by weather events that used to be "hundred year storms, fires, or floods" but are becoming yearly events. There are those who are insecure—not knowing where the next meal will come from, not knowing if they will have a home at the end of the month, not knowing if they will be safe at the hands of people who have claimed to love them. There are those who are invisible, marginalized, forgotten, and suffering in silence. There are those who are hanging by a thread, mourning the loss of someone they love to violence, suicide, illness, accident or even the natural passing of time. We ask that you comfort them in their anxiety, their shock, and their grief. We pray for those living as slaves to addiction and mental illness. We pray for those living incarcerated. These are problems that transcend geography and sociology, gender and identity but often take their biggest toll on people who have the least reserves of resistance. Lead us, Lord, to become part of your divine solution. We thank you for those saints who have come before us, who have impacted our lives and shown us examples of your love. Create in our hearts tolerance and acceptance of your children of all races, colors, genders and identities. Be with those who are standing up for change. Guide our church family as we look to remain a relevant and worthy reflection of your love. Help us to recognize ways that we can be there for others and do the work that you would have us do to be the saints that you would have us be. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen
