From The Music Committee:

As we have become more and more familiar with our new hymnal, there have been a few chuckles over some of the hymns that have the first verses in other languages. But truthfully, so much of who we are has come from other places and other peoples. As we listen to "Here Comes Santa Claus" and all the other holiday tunes, it is hard not to focus on the jolly man in the bright red suit. But what is it about him and Christmas?

Who is this Santa Claus? Well, according the the website aptly named <u>celebratingholidays.com</u>, "The name Santa Claus is the English form of the Dutch name for St. Nicholas: Sinterklaas." Saint Nicholas was a kind and



generous man born in modern day Turkey in the third century. He became a cleric who devoted his life to God and encouraged others to live similarly. After his death on December 6, the tradition of gift giving was begun in his memory. Later, his birthday and Christmas were combined, but Christian leaders didn't like the fact that he was taking focus away from Christ. German families began "teaching their children about the real gift giver, Kriss Kringle, which is the English form of the German name for 'Christ Child.'" Ironically, the names Kris Kringle and Santa Claus became connected with St. Nicholas. Santa didn't get his "jolly-ness" until the poem "Twas the Night Before Christmas" was written in 1823 to make St. Nicholas a more friendly image. And there you have it...Santa in a nutshell.
