#### **Kerry's Corner:**

Because we are about to turn the page of yet another month, I found myself thinking about spring. I love spring but as the time has passed she does not love me! It can cause one's eyes to tear up, the nose to run a little, and it's here for what seems like such a short time. So, I am trying to embrace it as much as time and space will allow.

As part of my vacation the week of the 22nd, I attended a Buddhist retreat center for the second time this year. It is meant to be a time of meditation both led and silent. My most recent time was Sunday the 28th. The day starts at 10 am and runs until 4 pm with 1 hour for lunch. This particular day was a meditation walking in a circle at various paces, one of which was so slow that you did not pick up your back foot until you had placed your lead foot heel, arch, ball of foot. It caused me to think about the seasons and how much we don't pay much attention to them. Sometimes we can't wait for one to be over so as to start the next one.

I came upon this poem from *Meditations of Henry David Thoreau* "Springs of Life" by Samuel Taylor Coleridge. I do hope you enjoy it as much as I do.

But the walking of which I speak has nothing in it akin to taking exercise, as it is called, as the sick take medicine at stated hours-as the swinging of dumbbells or chairs: but is itself the enterprise and adventure of the day. If you would get exercise, go in search of the springs of life. Think of man's swinging dumbbells for his health, when those springs are bubbling up in far-off pastures unsought by them!

Moreover, you must walk like a camel, which is said to be the only beast which ruminates when walking. When a traveler asked Wordsworth's servant to show him her master's study, she answered. "Here is his library, but his study is out of doors."

Living much out of doors, in the sun and wind, will no doubt produce a certain roughness of character-will cause a thicker cuticle to grow over some of the finer qualities of our nature, as on the face and hands, or as severe manual labor robs the hands of some of their delicacy of touch...There will be so much the more air and sunshine in our thoughts.

May you look at each day as a gift from God.


#### **From The Community Outreach Committee:**
